- 1 Write the management of an 11-month-old female infant with scabies under the following headings: 3+4+3
  - a) Write a prescription for treatment of the patient.
  - b) Instructions for using the medications and counseling of parents.
  - c) Treatment of complications.
- 2 A 26-year old, married female patient needs to be prescribed oral retinoids for her acne. 2.5x4
  - a) What baseline and follow up investigations need to be done for her?
  - b) What instructions would you give to such a patient?
  - c) How would you monitor such a patient?
  - d) What additional medications would you prescribe to such a patient to reduce the side effects of retinoid therapy?
- 3 A 2-year old female patient born to consanguineous parents presents with multiple hemorrhagic bullae (on hands, feet, elbows, knees and trunk) which heal with scarring and milia formation. She also has 'easy fragility of skin', shedding of nails and has oral lesions. A clinical diagnosis of epidermolysis bullosa (EB) is made. 3+3+4
  - a) Write the tests which you will perform to establish the type of EB.
  - b) What are the complications which are likely to develop in this patient?
  - c) Outline the management of this patient.
- 4 Enumerate the diagnostic criteria for diagnosis of: 3+4+3
  - a) Neurofibromatosis 1.
  - b) Systemic lupus erythematosus (SLICC criteria).
  - c) Dermatomyositis.
